The Transferware Collectors Club (TCC), founded in 1999 by an enthusiastic group interested in learning more about English transferware, held its first Annual Meeting in August, 2000. Since the inception, the number of programs and activities offered by the TCC has expanded each year, as has the membership. Currently the TCC affords members (and non-members) an informative and frequently updated website. All members receive a color-printed copy of the scholarly TCC Bulletin four times each year. In addition, the TCC

offers annual research grants made possible by the Paul & Gladys Richards Foundation.

Over the years, many dedicated volunteers have made it possible to further expand the educational offerings of the TCC. Among them are the informative and ever-expanding *Pattern and Source Print Database*, initiated in 2005, which is available to members on the website, as well as three online exhibitions available to members and the public at spodeceramics.com, americanhistoricalstaffordshire.com and, printedbritishpotteryandporcelain.com. The latter is the club's most recent offering, to be introduced for the first time at this 15th Annual Meeting. With such research aids, it is not surprising that the TCC has become a noted resource of well-researched information about English transferware produced between 1750 and 1900.



Currently, 20% of the TCC's 450 household memberships are international. Two memberships are included per household.
